What will the funds be used for?	If successful the funds will be used to assist in the purchase of a pop-up marquee. This equipment is essential for patient and volunteer protection during events and emergencies.
When will the project be started / completed?	The project will be completed shortly after the funds are received.
How does this project / activity meet the assessment criteria? Please answer every question	
How will you contribute to addressing gaps in service provision or community development programs and activities?	This project is aimed at allowing the rescue squad to facilitate first aid at events, as well as promoting patient safety during emergency responses. Without this service, local community groups are either without first aid or have to pay high prices for service. This allows funds to stay within the Warrumbungle Shire community. The Coonabarabran Rescue Squad proactively address the gap in rescue services within the area, being a highly qualified primary rescue unit.
How will your activities promote community development in a multicultural context and seek to address issues of access and equity?	The Coonabarabran Rescue Squad makes themselves available to all patients, regardless of culture, actively aiming to reduce the barriers to accessing rescue services. They are also committed to providing their services of first aid to various community groups, helping to ensure these groups can continue to operate safely, without a damaging economic burden.
Will your activity have involvement from volunteers?	The squad is entirely volunteer and as such all services provided are on the basis of volunteering, as well as all fundraising for equipment such as this marquee.
Will your activity incorporate self help initiatives which build upon Council's contribution?	This initiative will provide a professional and safe marquee, which will be used when volunteering at events and shows. This work generates donations to the squad and ensures that it can be self-sustaining into the future.
Does your activity encourage consumer /user participation in management of services / activities?	The Coonabarabran Rescue Squad is designed and continually re-assessed to ensure it can meet the needs of the entire community. As such there is always user participation in the management of these services. The squad also meets the requirements of all groups in relation to community events to suit their specific needs. This initiative has also been discussed and agreed upon through internal meetings.

How does your activity involve innovative and creative approaches to identified needs?	The Coonabarabran Rescue Squad requires a large marquee in order to meet the needs of patients who are exposed to all weather conditions at any time of day. There is also a need to keep volunteers safe at command posts. This marquee provides this protection, whilst also being used as a creative fundraising solution for ongoing costs and equipment purchases.
Will your activity use Council funding to attract further resources and funding?	This marquee will be used in fundraising events and the provision of first aid, which usually attracts a donation. These activities enable the squad to be self-sustaining into the future, instead of relying on continual Council funding.
How will your activities assist in the organisation to become self-supporting (ie; through fees and other income) and not totally reliant on grant funding?	Through this drought we have noticed a significant decrease in the disposable income individuals are able to donate to the squad, along with a decrease in time volunteers have for fundraising. As such this marquee will help to promote the squad and enable first aid to be completed for organisations within the district, in order to attract donations and ensure the squad is self-supporting.
If this activity is purely social nature, how will it address the needs of disadvantaged groups?	The Coonabarabran Rescue Squad address the needs of the disadvantaged by responding to rescue absolutely anyone who requires the services at any time. They also provide first aid services to ensure these groups are cared for.
Is your activity eligible for support from state-wide or regional parent bodies?	There is limited assistance available for rescue equipment, however no provision for the marquee requested through this grant is available.
Has your organisation observed accountability requirements for past Council assistance?	N/A

The funding will go towards the purchase of a pop-up marquee. The remainder of the funds required will be provided through previous fundraising gathered by the squad. An example of such fundraising is the provision of first aid services on a volunteer basis to the Equestrian Expo held over 5 days in Coonabarabran. The squad is entirely volunteer making an enormous in-kind donation in the form of volunteer hours.

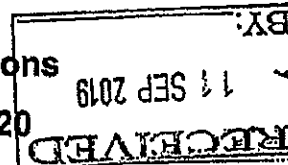

*Uniting will continue the current work we have been conducting within the community since July 2018. 2 Child & Family Counsellors outreach to Coolah every fortnight with weekly visits to commence in October 2019. These 2 Counsellors have also provided a therapeutic service to community individuals, families and businesses regarding drought, fire and relationship Counselling. Our entry into the community of Coolah was based on the need for Mental Health Services as identified by Health, Education, Police, NGO (non-Government Organisations) and community. It is our core belief that if an event/function is to be conducted within a community, that the organisation (Uniting) would continue to be engaged and provide a service to that community.

How will your activities promote community development in a multicultural context and seek to address issues of access and equity?

*The Men and Women's Pamper Day and Dinner will be inclusive of all members of the community. The event will respect all people wishing to participate and will promote social participation between community members, business owners and any CALD (culturally and linguistically diverse) members of the Coolah community and surround districts.

Will your activity have involvement from volunteers?

From our experience in past events of this nature, community will always come together to provide assistance in the form of volunteer hours to ensure a successful and well-structured event takes place. Volunteer hours include and are not limited to set up, assistance during the event and pack up. All successful events are based on people, planning, place and promotion.

Another aim of our event is to provide many long standing and committed volunteers to a "day off" too. The backbone of many small communities like Coolah hinges on the volunteer hours of local people. They too, deserve "a break" and "time out" to enjoy and participate in an event and not have to volunteer all day.

Will your activity incorporate self-help initiatives which build upon Council's contribution?

*This event will definitely incorporate self-help initiatives that will build upon Council's contribution. Uniting will continue to maintain a presence on a weekly basis in Coolah after the event and provide a service that our records show is required and requested.

Does your activity encourage consumer /user participation in management of services / activities?

*The event will give participants options of receiving a service during the day and attending the dinner at night, attending just the day event or just the evening event. Community consultation has taken place and community members have indicated the services that they believe will make a successful event ie: Yoga, hairdressing, beautician, massage, Reiki and a Public Speaker. Uniting will continue to support members of the community where a need has been identified through their weekly visits.

*We are requesting financial support for this event only

How will your activities assist in the organisation to become self-supporting (ie; through fees and other income) and not totally reliant on grant funding?

*Due to the current climatic conditions, Uniting will not be charging any fees for this event. Our therapeutic service conducted in Coolah is also a free service. Uniting is a NGO (Not for profit) organisation. Mental Health and personal wellbeing is of the utmost importance in these trying times and the provision of our service and events is an integral part of community participation and support.

Guests needs are met to the best of our capabilities in regards to access, dietary requirements etc. We do our best to cater for all.
