Budget submission for rainwater tank, fittings, and pump for the Goolhi hall.

Would Council please support the funding of a new water tank and pump for the Goolhi hall in your draft operational plan 23/24.

The replacement of the tank and pump has been raised with council at the Goolhi consultation meeting and again at the recent Mullaley consultation meeting. The tank has previously been repaired using plastic welding, but it continues to fail in different areas.

The Goolhi hall is sustaining significant damage to its footings and structure because of this burst tank. The tank supplies water to the kitchen and toilets block. Unfortunately, we have now also sustained damage to our kindly donated coffee machine as it ran out of water and burnt out the heating element.

Goolhi Hall Committee wishes to run further events at our hall. We still have funding money available from NSW Government and Warrumbungle shire council to help with the next event. A functioning toilet block will be imperative, or it could all come to a sticky end. Please see attached video of the leaking tank and photos of internal damage to building.

Goolhi Hall Committed has been generously offered some savings towards these items which council could benefit from.

A local distributor has offered a 22500lt low profile rainwater tank and pump at their cost price. 22500lt tank \$2751, 100lt/min water pump \$789, 100mm first water diverter \$117 exclusive of GST.

Another local business has generously offered the supply of tank base material to lay the tank on, free of charge.

Members of the Goolhi community are willing and able to install the tank into position and connect the pump.

Maintenance of road verges generally throughout the Council area.

On Good Friday 2022 I was traveling along Neilex Road, toward Coolah just west of the Mount Hope Road intersection when I hit a Kangaroo. I was aware that there were Kangaroos in the area and was traveling at about half of the speed limit in order to avoid them should that become necessary however the roadside grasses had not been cut, it would seem, for quite a long time as they were about a

meter high right up to the bitumen edge. A kangaroo came straight out of these long grasses and was hit by me, fortunately not fatally (evidence of my low speed and caution) but sufficiently hard to badly damage my new car.

The insurance company noted the claim as my fault however the real fault here was with Warrumbungle Shire Council who consistently fail to maintain the Shires roads and road verges! With the length of grass there was absolutely no way that

either the kangaroo or I could have seen each other and avoided the collision. Council must maintain its road verges!

Councils including Warrumbungle Shire Council are mitigating their obligations by passing the costs on to motorists, insurance companies and wildlife by failing to adequately maintain their roads and road verges.

I have already addressed this to my insurance company questioning just how much they pay out in insurance claims for collisions with wildlife, you can expect that Insurance companies will start to look at this expenditure and passing the liability and costs back onto Councils who do not conduct appropriate maintenance.

You must allow for maintenance of road verges in your works plans, road side grasses should never get longer that 2-300mm.

I have previously been advised by Council staff that street sweeping of Wentworth Avenue, Coolah is not included in Councils scope of works for Street sweeping. Why is this? The residents of

Wentworth avenue pay rates and are entitled to the normal services associated with those provided

to the remainder of the town.

Wentworth Avenue is constantly littered with leaf matter and this causes safety problems for both wildlife and residents. Animals such as lizards, echidnas, turtles, birds and others are commonly found taking advantage of the warm bitumen and relative disguise offered by the leaf litter and in doing so are killed by vehicles who do not see them because they are hidden by the leaf litter. Road users who do see the animals late and swerve to avoid them are at risk of crashing on this narrow road that has, for most of its length unmaintained eroded and unformed gutters.

Please add Wentworth Avenue to the programme of street sweeping.


I am writing to you on behalf of the Baradine & District Progress Association with the following submission for the Council draft 2023/2024 Operational Plan;
