Christiana McCubbin, wife of James McCubbin, widely accepted as the "father of Coolah" came to Coolah with her husband + family circa 1846, and established a hotel near the present day motel and later a blacksmith shop nearby.

The McCubbins bought the first freehold land in Coolah, 160 acres, and appear to have prospered until Christiana's untimely death from T.B. aged 31, leaving a husband and four/five children.

Her grave is an exceptional monument for its time, set near the Presbyterian church which now shows deterioration of the walls.

The Historical society has conversed with the descendants of the McCubbin family, who have guaranteed \$1000 towards the preservation, as outlined by the Heritage adviser to the council, and the Historical socy. has managed to secure the services of a local stone mason to do the work.

The councils \$500 will provide the materials to construct a roof over the

grave, which will be constructed by voluntary labour of the Historical Society members, and the nearby tree will be lopped by a professional ~~to~~ arborist, as suggested by the Heritage advisor.

The Presbyterian church is supportive of the whole procedure.

The old Coolah Shire fenced off the Three Creek cemetery, after 2003, when it was acquired from the Anglican church.

Research by Roy Cameron OAM, has found 25 burials in the cemetery.

These were compiled + further researched by Jim Elliot of Coolah.

There appears to be only 3/4 headstones in the cemetery, which the passage of time, and perhaps marauding stock prior to fencing have deteriorated. The Historical society will voluntarily refurbish those graves, and mount the sign, if the application is successful.

TUREE CREEK PIONEER CEMETERY

An estimate of the number of persons buried in the Turee Vale Pioneer Cemetery is twenty five. However, headstones records the burial of members of well known pioneers families, such as Dean, Exley, Lang, Wheeler and Head, these burials taking place between the years 1875 and 1915. The cemetery was established in the 1860s' the boundaries being determined by Surveyor, W.R. Davidson in 1880. Freehold of the one acre area was granted in 1882 and held by the Anglican Church of Australia until 2003 when the land was acquired by the Coolah Shire Council who desired to fence the area to prevent further damage by stock to the remaining headstones.

The Pioneer Cemetery is situated on the western side of the Turee Creek Road at about 6 kms from the junction of the Coolah-Creek Road, and 15 kms south east of Coolah. Access to the cemetery off the Turee Vale Road is by a short length of crown road. All the boundaries of the cemetery adjoin private property owned by Ian Sutton, of 'Benwerrin', Coolah.

The designated area is unique, for not only did it contain a cemetery, but also a church, school and a post office. There was a nearby settlement of about ten slab like huts being the abode of settlers who had there own 40 acre blocks and supplemented their incomes by working for the owners of larger properties. Towards the end of the nineteenth century most of the small property owners from Turee Vale moved into Coolah, and started businesses one eventually building a hotel.

The school opened in 1863 mainly through the efforts of Reverend William Wilson of Cassilis and closed in 1883 when a school had been provided further down Turee Creek towards Uarbry. For many years the school master was teacher and postmaster. The Turee Vale School was the first centre of learning in the Coolah Shire area, the school at Coolah not being opened until 1866.

In the 1860s' the settlement at Turee Vale (also known as Turee Creek) was served by the Turee Vale-Yarraman bridle track which ran from the Coolah-Cassilis Road pass the Turee Vale settlement over the Liverpool Range through Yarraman Gap to Yarraman and Blackville in the Liverpool Plains.

Several members of the Dean family are buried in the cemetery, one being buried there on 20th. March, 1894, being William Dean, age 69 years. William Dean was the son of John Dean who arrived in the Colony in 1856 and purchased a 600 acre portion of the property now known as 'Springvale' on Turee Creek. When John Dean died 'Springvale' was inherited by William who by selections and purchase increased the size of the property to 7,000 acres. On his death in 1894 the property passed to his wife, Sarah Dean, who purchased 'Booyamurra Station, thus adding an additional 3,000 acres.

The Maitland Mercury of 29th. September, 1885, reported an exceedingly sad event had occurred three days previously at Turee Creek, when two young men aged 25 and 30, named John and Joseph Dean, sons of William and Sarah Dean, died from congestion of the lungs brought on by severe colds. Dr. Russell of Merriwa as called, but too late to do any good. Both are buried in the Turee Creek Cemetery. John and Joseph Dean attended the Turee Creek School with William and Arkell Dean.

and members of the Head and Worrell families. Sarah and Thomas Head, who died within 3 days of each other, in 1875, are buried in the Turee Vale Cemetery. The first known burial in the cemetery was in 1862, the 18 months old, baby son of Robert and Harriet Wheeler. The last burial was Mary Ann Jones ^who died in September, 1915, aged 90 years. Mary Jones married David Jones, a boundary rider in 1890, and for many years resided at Turee Creek. She was not related to the Jones family who at one time owned Turee Station.

In addition to the bridle track from Turee Creek over the Coolah Tops to Yarraman, Turee Creek settlement had a bridle track connection with Cassilis through Rotherwood and a bridle track to Coolah via Booyamurra. In times of emergency it was found that a horse rider following the known bridle track could cover the journey in less time than travelling via Pandora Pass.

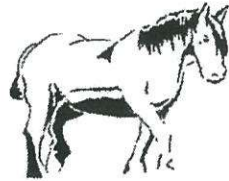

To whom it may concern,

The WAGS (Wednesday activity group) group would like to be considered and request Financial Assistance through Warrumbungle Shire Council's financial assistance program. I have read the Assessment Criteria and feel that the WAGS group does meet the criteria.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:

• **Activities which address gaps in service or community development.**

The WAGS group offers a social day per week where people come together and chat, play cards and organise activities such as luncheons, bus trips etc. Members of this group are socially isolated and most have no transport and limited funds. I believe that the WAGS group does address gaps such as social support and promotes the development of social skills and promotes wellbeing for its members.

• **Activities which promote community development in a multicultural context and seek to address issues of access and equity.**

Coolah only has a small percentage of multicultural people living in our community however this group is open and welcomes new people. Currently within the group there are people who have a learning Disability. The group plans to utilise our Library and encourage and support members to use the facilities available. This does address access & equity and I believe provides support to those who otherwise would never feel comfortable doing such activities. Future outings by bus to locations within our Shire would also provide access opportunities for its members.

• **Involvement from Volunteers and self help initiatives which build upon Councils contribution.**

The WAGS group has 5 active volunteers on a roster basis who assist our paid Respite worker who enjoy activities with members. WAGS is a self funded group, each member and volunteer pays \$2 each time they attend to go towards bingo prizes, luncheons out and their Xmas club. The group bring their own lunches on days they stay in the centre and morning tea is donated & provided on a roster basis. Easter this year they held an Easter raffle and raised \$500 they also hold a street stall once a year which after discussion at their quarterly meeting last week will now hold two. The members make and donate craft items and they approach local businesses for donations of goods or vouchers to make a hamper which is raffled.

• **Consumer / use participation in management of services / activities.**

Everyone involved in this group work together to make decisions and organise activities. After last weeks meeting it was agreed that they need to promote WAGS within our Community to encourage others to come along. Flyers have been displayed and 3 Rivers radio will promote during Community announcements. They hope to do a bus outing every 3 months also they would like to visit our local Hostel and invite residents there to have card or bingo days. The Coolah Diary has also agreed to run an article for the group on a regular basis.

• **Innovative and creative approaches to identified needs.**


I am assisting and supporting the group to look outside the square and think of new ideas. The use of the Library will indeed meet some of the members needs along with outings. Fundraising to ensure that the group is financial so they can continue to provide social support to its members. They are all very motivated to increase their membership and broaden their activities to meet needs and encourage new members.

- **Activities, which use Council funding to attract further recourses.**

If WAGS are lucky enough to receive financial assistance from Council the money would enable the group to purchase new recourses to provide new activities. It will enable more bus trips and assist in future accomplishments of its members and volunteers which will help to ensure that the WAGS group grows in numbers in the future. The members of this group are very excited about the prospect of expanding its membership and enjoying different activities. It will also be a huge boost to its members and give them a sense of accomplishment.

I believe that WAGS do meet each point of the Criteria and we all appreciate the opportunity to apply and thank you for your consideration.

Girl's Business – Pilot Project

Objective: To train local girls of ages 14-15 how to identify a market need, develop a product, market and sell the product. This will be a guided 2 hours per day course with access to internet and computers outside of teaching time.

Stakeholders:

Myself: providing premises for teaching. Computers for access to the internet, product creation, marketing. Developing training programme. Providing materials and training. Organising stakeholders.

Local business people: individual business people with skills in freelance photography, video creation, marketing etc.

Local CWA: Providing content for product creation.

On demand printing service: printing of product
