Provide details of your project and target group and describe how your project will address matters of access, equity and cater to community diversity: The Museum would like to expand its display of old Dunedoo photo prints onto the walls of our local library. Over the last 15 years the Dunedoo History and Research area in the library has grown from 1 resource book of the area to over 50 books, plus numerous digital images plus access to facilities like trove on the computer. The libraries location and right beside the Museum, gets a lot of visitors, especially the elderly. The photos will enhance our History collection and share our stories.

Details of how Council's funds will be expended: The \$500 dollars will go towards getting old photos enlarged onto canvas and hung on the blank walls within the library. We hope with the \$500 that we will get 10 prints roughly 600x600mm. At the moment there are no pictures hangings in the library- money that was allocated during the refurbishment of the library, for wall hangings, never eventuated.

Please list any donations given to your organisation by Council, over the last two years: The Museum has been fortunate to have received 3x\$500 over the last 2 years. \$1000 of this money went into the ' History on the Porch' and ' A Step Back in Time'- which have attracted a lot of interest with visitors and the community. We were also successful with a \$500 donation to go towards getting our mural in front of the supermarket updated- this will happen after Silo Art is completed.

What other financial support does your organisation receive? : We are a community organisation and our only financial support is through museum entry fees- about \$400 a year and donations

It is open 4 days a week. It is a perfect place to put up a permanent Photo Heritage Display. Provide details of your project and target group and describe how your project will address matters of access, equity and cater to community diversity: Star Art is a yearly art competition timed to run at the same time as the Siding Spring Open Day events, but not affiliated with, or supported by SSO. The competition is a completely inclusive art competition where art from all over the shire is judged without voters knowing who painted what. This has lead to the remarkable results of people with disability winning the last 2 years.
Details of how Council's funds will be expended: The funding will be used for the prize money for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize. Normally we would have been able to do fund raising ourselves but Covid has kept us in isolation and local businesses are doing it tough and are unable to contribute.
Please list any donations given to your organisation by Council, over the last two years: We received \$500 in 2019 for heavy duty seating which is used on a daily basis by people and community groups using the gallery.
What other financial support does your organisation receive? : In 1st half of 2020 the group has received only grant money and minimal donations due to Covid19 (we closed earlier in teh year and opened later than all local businesses due to our high risk volunteers). This year we have been funded for a collaborative art project with poets in Newcastle, an equipment grant for the NSW Creative Kids program, and some DPI Drought Relief money for a public art prject later in the year.
How will the donation you have requested benefit Warrumbungle Shire residents and meet the outcomes of Council's Community Strategic Plan and/or Delivery Program and address gaps in service provision? : The Council's strategic plan CC3 with CC3.1 Work with local communities to develop and expand local arts and cultural activities, programs and events. Star Art is a local art event that will expand with enticing prize money and will one day, we hope, be well known on the calendar of art competitions.



During the extreme conditions of the recent drought, trees and shrubs planted at the hall were all lost; even the two Magnolia trees, which had been planted some 30 years ago, died. Landscapes and attractive beautification features are important because they contribute significantly to our well-being and quality of life and general 'good-feel' about our town and pride in community. The lack of landscaping at the CWA hall gives a poor impression of our overall care for the town and needs to be remedied. The acquisition and planting of new native species will not only beautify the CWA Hall surrounds, but visually demonstrate that we 'care for our community' and how it looks and contributes to improving the quality of life for local residents, as well as generate interest in the work of the Country Women's Association and its place in our community. Baradine CWA members and whole of community will benefit from this project that contributes to town beautification.</p>
