<p>Town Swimming Pool</p> <p>Concerns were raised by the community regarding the town Swimming pool, these were;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Opening Times. General Manager Roger Bailey advised that the trial was to extend the swimming pool opening hours. • Due to the lack of open hour the numbers of individuals attending would be lower. • Concerned around the price of having a key and season ticket. • Lifeguards – Concern raised around how expensive it is to do a lifeguard course • Only two recreational areas for the community in Binnaway (Swimming Pool and Oval) therefore Binnaway would like to see the swimming pool open. • Wrong information being release in the media release as usage numbers should take into consideration per capita. General Manager Roger Bailey advised that the media release was a response to a concern raised. The numbers on the media release are for the previous pool hours in the last years season so that the numbers weren't distorted. • Swimming pool sign in system – Concerns that Lifeguards are just sitting in the office and not enforcing the sign on sheet therefore may not collect the money for those without a season ticket. 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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The lifeguards make the atmosphere at the swimming so Council needs to ensure a safe and friendly environment is creating with the employed lifeguard. Is there an opportunity for the Community to work with Council in rearranging the time table for the opening times of the swimming pools? Is Council open to the idea of having volunteers lifeguards with the swimming club. There are certain rules we need to follow and have the correct training. <p>Director Technical Services (DTS) Kevin Tighe advised the Binnaway Community that Council is looking into course and training which could be provided to the community for lifeguards.</p> <p>Action: DTS will take the sign in book on notice and investigate.</p>
