<p>4. Item 6 – Road issues across the Shire Greg Piper passed on thanks to guys working for last couple of weeks but some things had not been done. Greg questioned Council policy to not seek consultation with road users and suggested that Council workers should contact local road users and residents before coming to work on the road.</p> <p>DTS advised that recent work was emergency work and more work to be done. Best to talk to the supervisor rather than the grader operator.</p> <p>ACTION: DTS to investigate work that has not been addressed and put it into the schedule.</p>	TS	<p>28.06.21 – Onsite discussion with Greg Piper regarding three locations on Moorefield Road is yet to be arranged.</p> <p>23.05.22 – Meeting with Greg Piper to be arranged in next month.</p> <p>01.08.22 – It is not practicable for Council to consult residents every time they do work on the road though we will consult on major projects such as gravel resheeting or sealed road rehabilitations.</p> <p>Council is still in the process of finalising natural disaster recovery funding for this road. It is not known at this stage when we will have an update on this funding outcome.</p> <p>22.03.23 – Consultation issues with residents was discussed at the Warrumbungle Network Advisory Group meeting on 14 March 2023. <p>7 Carol Richards notes an email from Mr Roy Cameron who advised that there were flood gauges and is asking if the water gauge is still on the Coolaburragundy River? DTS advised that this was not council responsibility. There are gauging stations that are automatic.</p> <p>ACTION: DTS to enquire if gauges are operational.</p>	TS	<p>22.01.22 – Followed up with Bureau of Meteorology to check if gauges are operational. No response at the time of writing. 01.03.22 – No response from Bureau of Meteorology to date. 23.05.22 – Sent a follow up request to Bureau of Meteorology. 07.07.22 – No response from Bureau of Meteorology to date. 12.08.22 – No response from Bureau of Meteorology to date. 05.01.23 – Advice from Water NSW is that the closest gauge to Coolah is on the Talbragar River near Dunedoo – a relatively recent gauge (421904) installed in 2017.</p> <p>There used to be a site at Coolah on the Coolaburragundy River (421056 – Coolaburragundy River at Coolah), but this was closed in 1999. Other sites in the upper catchment used to exist as well, but these have all been closed for many years.</p> <p>04.01.23 – DCCS contacted Water NSW. Gauge in Coolaburragundy river was decommissioned in 1999.</p>	Completed
