- 9. Riverwalk Clean up help needed urgently. There is a lot of flood debris(logs, rocks etc) over the Riverwalk area. This is making it inaccessible to mowers. We would very much appreciate help from the Council backhoe to assist by removing the logs and debris to an area that is suitable and out of the way. It is good habitat for birds and animals. Our Landcare volunteers have not been able to get down to do mowing and whipper snipping due to this flood debris and very wet black soil. There are a couple of areas of the pathway that need clearing as water is pooling and making it inaccessible for our elderly residents. They love this space and at present are unable to use it safely. Once we get it back we will then be able to once again work alongside Council to maintain it. This is a very necessary space for our community in many ways. Many thanks for listening to our request for help.
