Council advised that water from the bore had been tested and results had shown that there was no contamination of the water. Residents also expressed concerns regarding the lack of water pressure during the summer months when demand is higher.

Information about water pressure noted. Funding is being sought for installation of a pressure booster. A detailed application has been submitted in September 2018.

Update: Funding has been received for a Scoping Study including concept designs.

The funding is \$126,500, including a Council contribution of \$31,625.

A tender for the concept design of the required upgrade works is currently advertised (closes 19/08

Completion of the Concept Design has been awarded to a consultant, following a Council resolution in September 2019

Update: Concept design is under way; re raw water quality: Council develop a groundwater quality assurance program + a Health support project was commissioned to establish bore water quality baselines throughout the Shire – this project has commenced
