Dear General Manager,

In honour of my parents, I would like to submit the name *REILLY RESERVE*, for the Reserve No. R86082 on the corner of Gordon and Hill Streets Coonabarabran.

The Reilly connection to this area goes back to the early 1900's. My great grandparents lived on the western flank of the reserve. The old dirt Baradine Road bordered the northern side of the reserve at that time and a dirt track to the south was Gordon Street. Families living opposite the reserve included the Greenhalghs, the Kubskies and the Schwagers.

My great grandmother, Sophia McDonald, gave the block next to hers to my father, James Angus Reilly, whom she had reared, and he and his wife Lyla built a house prior to World War II. Both lived in this house until their deaths, dad in 1982 and mum in 2017 at the age of 95. Mum would have been 100 on 26<sup>th</sup> December this year, so it would be nice to have the reserve in the Reilly name to celebrate.

James Angus (Bert) Reilly enlisted in the RAAF shortly after building his home in Gordon Street and served in Borneo for five years. He was a much respected member of the community and volunteered (with his truck) on several Coonabarabran projects including the swimming pool and the tennis courts.

My mother was also a great townsperson and worked tirelessly for the Far West Children's Health Scheme, the Red Cross and the RSL Women's Auxiliary. Together they raised six children, all of whom attended the Coonabarabran Public School and the High School.

I have great memories of living "over the river". We played on the reserve, swam in the river at the end of the street and played on the hill opposite. We walked past the reserve on the way to school and experienced the bread cart, the milkman, the ice man and the "dunny" man travelling over the dirt track that was our Gordon Street.

Eventually my great grandparent's house was demolished and another house was built there (17 Gordon Street) and many years later the Martin's built the house facing the reserve. The Martin's were respected people and operated the Handee Store. It was sad to see the old houses demolished to build the store. It was towards the latter part of their lives, after their children had left home that they actually lived in Gordon Street, a short while in comparison to other residences.

My sisters, and myself had/have lived in Coonabarabran all our lives. and I are both over 70 and still have a strong connection to our town and former home in Gordon Street. Occasionally we go for a drive and remember the people that built in the area and our lives growing up there.

I do hope you consider my submission. In fairness and love of my parents, I thought I would put my case forward, to name this reserve *REILLY RESERVE*, in honour of a family who lived there for so long.
