How does this project The Coonabarabran Show is an annual event, held in March. The show is organised by the Coonabarabran PAI&H association which is a non-for -profit organization. The show is one of Coonabarabran's largest community events attracting more than 3000 people over the two and a half days of the show. All income from the show is used to run the following show as well as make improvements to the Coonabarabran Show Ground, which is used by a variety of community groups.

> The show brings the community together offering events and activities that appeal to all ages and demographics of our community as well as attracting both competitors and spectators to our town. The show also acts as a platform for other community groups to raise funds, for instance the local Rugby club, Rotary, Coona High School P&C and the Primary School P&C just to name a few.

The PAI&H association is asking council to subsidise the collection of waste generated by the show. The PAI&H was charged \$1463 for waste collection for the 2023 show and \$801 for the 2022 Show. We have made a significant effort over the last two years to reduce



The financial grant from Council along with a matching financial contribution from the Club will be used to purchase and install a new electric freestanding stove and oven in the kitchen.

Over the last two years, the Club has experienced an increase in the number of tournaments and competitions. A regional junior tournament in May is now an annual event along with regional training days for juniors in August and November. Other local tennis activities include Tuesday night ladies' competition, Thursday night mixed competition and junior tennis on Friday afternoons in school terms 1 and 4.
