

Level 1 Water Restrictions

The following updated restrictions on the use of town water in Coonabarabran are now in place. These restrictions will be in place until further notice. This notice is given in accordance with *Regulation 137* of the *Local Government (General) Regulation 2021*. Your cooperation in complying with these restrictions is appreciated. Failure to comply may result in restrictions or disconnection of services.
