

Level 2 Water Restrictions

The following updated restrictions on the use of town water in Coonabarabran are now in place. These restrictions will be in place until further notice. This notice is given in accordance with *Regulation 137 of the Local Government (General) Regulation 2021*. Your cooperation in complying with these restrictions is appreciated. Failure to comply may result in restrictions or disconnection of services.

Domestic – target water consumption of 240 litres per person, per day	
Watering of lawns and residential gardens Note: Subject to varying Summer and Winter times	Watering systems, non fixed sprinklers, hand held hoses, microsprays, drip systems and soaker hoses, only between: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Summer: 6am – 9am and 6pm – 9pm every second day as per odds and evens system. • Winter: 7am – 10am and 4pm – 7pm every second day as per odds and evens system.
Filling or topping up of garden water features	Permitted
First fill or topping up of private swimming	Only between the hours of 7:00am and 9:00am and between 6:00pm and 8:00pm on any day.
Inflatable or temporary children's pools	Permitted
New turf irrigation	Permitted for one week after laying after which Level 2 restrictions on watering lawns applies.
Washing down walls or paved Surfaces	Not permitted
Washing cars at home	Permitted with bucket and rinse with trigger hose only, on lawn, between 9:00am and 12:00pm any day.
Baths and showers	Permitted
Washing of clothes	Permitted
Evaporative air conditioners	Permitted

Commercial and Non-Residential

First fill or topping up of public swimming pools or spas, including motels	Only between the hours of 7:00am and 9:00am and
Turf farm irrigation and market gardens	Permitted
Irrigation of new turf at non-residential premises	Permitted for one week after laying after which Level 2 restrictions on watering lawns applies.
Cleaning - exterior	Permitted with trigger hoses, any time

ODDS AND EVENS SYSTEM

This means that if the street number of your property is odd you can water in accordance with the restrictions on odd days.

If your property has an even number you can water in accordance with the restrictions on even days.

If your property has a range of street numbers then it should be treated as odd or even as per the first number in the range. For example if your property is 12-15 Smith Street then you can water on even days in accordance with the restrictions.

If your property has no street number then it should be treated as an even property. For example if your property is "Tara" then you can water on even days in accordance with the restrictions.
