“Council has arranged for Jenny Dowell to present at these workshops as she brings a wealth of knowledge to the candidate briefings for NSW councils. Jenny delivers a wide range of pre- and post-election training last local government elections,” said Cr Doolan.

“Nominations to stand in the local government elections close in August 2021, so now is your chance to nominate to represent your community,” concluded Cr Doolan.
