Interested in working in and supporting our local communities? Warrumbungle Community Care is seeking casual support/respice workers to provide support to those in need.

Australia’s population is ageing and the demand for adequate aged care has gone up in the last few years. The huge disparity between the demand and supply of Aged Care Workers is pushing for our elderly to stay at home for longer to receive in home care and support.

The first step is to come and talk to Warrumbungle Shire Council’s arm of aged care services, Warrumbungle Community Care, who is looking for trained, or willing to obtain, a certificate in Aged Care through TAFE, to join their team of casual support/respice workers, who service and care for in-home clients,” Cr Doolan explained.
