If residents are planning on purchasing and building on vacant land, it is important to consult with Council's planning and development staff prior to the lodgment of a development application. This can ensure that all legislative and local requirements are met.

"It is an exciting time for the Warrumbungle region, and Council encourages this positive change and development," Cr Doolan concluded.
