A great way to ensure your pets are safe when you go away is to have someone looking after them at home in the holidays. This is a good way to make sure your pets are getting fresh food, water, regular exercise and attention, and don't go wandering.

If you are travelling with pets this summer, make sure they are restrained safely in the car or on the ute and be mindful of hot temperatures inside your car or on ute trays. Ensure you give your pets regular rest breaks during your trip so they can stay hydrated and stretch their legs.

It is also important to remember animals cannot eat all the yummy treats and foods we do, so please be aware of the festive foods you may like to give your animals to avoid unnecessary illness for your animals and visits to the vets.

If you are planning on committing to a new pet please remember that puppies and kittens may be a nice Christmas gift but are a lifelong commitment with responsibilities including microchipping, desexing and registering your animals.
